A Wartime Footing!

Locked Down But Definitely Not Out. Something to Celebrate

Did you hear early morning thumping noises in February and wondered what they were?

Helsby Community Sports Club members heard the sound and knew that a longed for Dream was becoming a Reality. A reality that heralded the setting down of the New Club Foundations after Twelve Long Determined Years!

For decades' members of Helsby Community Sports Club have waited for the development of new sports club facilities. In 2005 Vale Royal Borough Council bought the club from the BICC preserving a valuable recreational centre for the area. But as we all know there is no such thing as a free lunch and it soon became apparent that the club building was beyond economical repair and it was necessary to form a team to explore the possible redevelopment of the club.

The Brookhouse Group, who owned the old BICC site, suggested a land swap and relocation of the club. Plans were prepared which included housing the Parish Office in the club. Public consultations took place with 96% of those attending approving the scheme. However, as is ever the way with ambitious projects, funding proved difficult. The Sports club applied to the Parish Council for a grant of £200,000. In the event the council agreed to ring fence a small part of the annual precept to form a resident's fund of £100,000 and this has been accruing over the last 12 years.

Years of submitting and resubmitting plans have followed. Alongside these, complicated and protracted negotiations with developers, CWAC and the club took place until eventually, in March 2018, agreement was finally reached to have a 3 phase delivery plan which facilitated the building of the new club and the land swap.

It is hoped that phases 1 and 2 will be



completed by the end of September 2020 (weather permitting) and will provide a 3G football pitch, 2 artificial bowling greens,4 full size tennis courts, a brand new building with modern changing facilities, a kitchen, sports bar and function rooms available for community hire.

Brookhouse is funding the new build by the land swap and the sale of the present club site to Trafford Housing Trust who have planning permission for 118 houses. Once the build is complete the club will vacate the existing facility and move to its new home.

The club's development team are very grateful to Brookhouse for their support and their willingness to stay with the project throughout the years it has taken to secure this fantastic facility. It will serve Helsby and the surrounding community for generations to come.

The team are continuing to work on obtaining funding from either a sponsor or by grant funding for phase 3 which is for the planned delivery of a full sized Sports Hall, fitness suite and additional changing rooms.

But for now it is time to celebrate and congratulate all those involved. Determined and dedicated folk who never gave up on the Dream.

CF Fertilisers wins Safety Award

CF Fertilisers, the local Ince-based manufacturing site for international fertiliser producer, CF Industries, has achieved global recognition for innovation in safety by winning the company's Stephen R. Wilson Award for Excellence in Safety.

Each year, CF's nine manufacturing complexes and distribution facilities submit nominations for the Wilson Award based on safety innovations and improvements generated by employees and transferable to all CF Global sites.

Two local electrical engineers Leigh Williams and Luke Simpson, part of the Ince CF team, designed the site's winning submission; an extremely effective 'trapped-key' interlock system that keeps their electrical workers safe when working with high voltage electricity.





UP UP AND AWAY

We are all aware of how quickly technology changes, almost on a daily basis. This you may think is the same for the aviation industry. While aircraft design has moved with this fast pace producing much quieter and more fuel-efficient designs, the air traffic control systems still run on 1960 technology. The current system relies on a series of ground-based radio beacons and VHF radio communications.

The CAA (Civil Aviation Authority) are who responsible for aircraft movements are consulting on the future introduction of a satellite GPS system to improve the routing of aircraft. The new system will alleviate the need to hold aircraft in a circling pattern waiting for landing slots or moving to different flight levels.

The CAA would like to hear the views of residents in the area near airports. 
