Formal logging through the police website or by email, of incidents like speeding, unruly behaviour or vandalism. It is the accumulation of written reports that is most likely to prompt follow up action.

Hearsay doesn't do it. Take the time to write it down and send it off.

Hello! Thank you for this opportunity to introduce myself.



Marshes Community Benefit Fund – 5 Projects Awarded Grants of £28,212

Weaver Words

 \pounds 2,000 creative writing sessions in local schools with leading local poets. The theme of "New Beginnings" hopes to promote creative writing about life after lockdown.

Association of Frodsham Townfield Allotments (AFTA)

 \pm 3,050 to purchase a ride- on lawn mower. This help will reduce the need to increase rental costs for tenants as there will no longer be a need to use contract grass cutters.

The Good Shed

£2,611.92 towards providing resources for the latest project, Main Street Memory Café in Frodsham. This volunteer led café will provide support, a listening ear and signposting to relevant services for people living with memory loss or dementia and carers and loved ones.

OPAL

£19,000 to fund a new service called OPAL Choices, building on existing and developing welcoming social hubs for older people, aged 60 and over, who are at risk of social isolation and loneliness.

Dunham Hill and Hapsford Parish Council

£1,550 towards their project, 'Improving the area of Hapsford". This support will be used to improve the green space within the rural hamlet. The parish council, with community involvement, will extend the planting of wild flowers over the next two years between Helsby and Hapsford and the M56 junction.

A Word from the Chair

The MCBF continues to support community-based projects across the region. What has been especially pleasing in the last 2 rounds of funding is the variety of services we have been able to support with the grants that have been issued.

The launch of the new Golden Grant award for grants up to £1,000 has generated a significant amount of social media interest and there will be a further press release relating to these grant awards shortly. As always, I would like to thank all of the panel members who volunteer to





give their time generously to support the fund.

Helsby Community Sports Club - The Next Stage.

We can hardly believe it has been 18 months since the new sports club (behind Tesco) has been operating.

During this time we have seen many members of our community using the club's sporting and hospitality facilities. Having established our basic operating protocols; ensuring that the club is financially viable and a safe place to have fun; both sporting and social, we now look forward to the next stage of our development.

Up until now, all the sporting sections (tennis, rugby, football, running, snooker and bowls) have operated as separate organisations, with each section carrying out their own administration. We now feel we are at the stage where the club is in a position to better support the individual sports and are in the process of bringing all these sports together into "one club working within our community", allowing the individual sports to concentrate on what they do best – coaching and playing sport. This development also gives us the advantage of securing our status as a CASC (Community Amateur Sports Club), allowing us to take advantage of the financial benefits afforded by HMRC for this status. As part of this initiative, we have invested in a new Sports Development Officer - Kate Merrick.
