PAVILION PARK. GOOD NEWS?

Construction company Onward Homes reports that it has entered into a contract with Countryside Homes to complete the development of 100% affordable houses on the newly named Pavilion Park. The original contractor, Lane End, went into administration and the development stalled.

Helsby News understands that construction work has started and will be in line with the original proposals for the site. The site is at the end of Cable Drive.

We are told that the first new homes will be completed next year and that over the coming years, Pavilion Park is expected to provide 85 new homes for affordable rent and 130 for shared ownership or rent to buy.

But what of the rest of the sites?

How long will the Developer fences on the A56 continue to be a blight on the southern entrance to the village? Is it too much to hope that this small glimmer from Pavilion Park is the beginning of light at the end of the tunnel?

Unfortunately it is. There is only a big fat silence from those who paid to put up the fence and Helsby is stuck with a continuing development nightmare.

Parish Precept

Helsby Parish Council has calculated that, due to increased costs, it would need to increase the Band D precept charge by around 9% this year. However, mindful not to overburden already stretched taxpayers, the HPC have requested a much lower increase of 5.4% from Cheshire West and Chester Council.

It has been agreed to cover any shortfalls in 2024/25 from general reserves. Based on a precept amount of £109,040, a Band D property will pay £52.00 (a cost of £1 per week), an increase of £2.68 a year when compared with 2023/24.

Helsby Parish Council Monthly Meetings Move to a New Location

Starting in June, the Helsby Parish Council will hold their monthly meetings at a new venue. Instead of the Methodist Church, meetings are now taking place at the Parish Council Office on the ground floor of the Helsby Community Sports Club.

This new location offers several benefits, including secure wi-fi and more parking spaces for both councillors and residents.

Follow-Up from our Borough Councillor

Cllr Chris Copeman told Helsby News that the historic contaminated tip site at Commonside, which drains into Foxhill Brook, is now receiving more attention. He and three other local councillors, recently had a meeting with senior council environmental officers at Cheshire West to ask what action is finally being taken. The council has now opened discussions with the Environment agency and the Government's Hazardous Substances Advisory Committee to decide on what measures need to be taken.

We understand that a local engineer has written an article about this site which can be read at the following https://northwestbylines.co.uk/environment/pollution/still-leaching-after-all-these-years/

Chris also reports that Protos, who are developing the Ince Resource Recovery Park, have recently put in a planning application to remove the obligation to develop a rail link to the site.

Protos originally obtained planning for this site at an appeal, decided by the Secretary of State. Under that agreement Protos is required to make use of the nearby rail and water links for transporting materials as well as road transport. Currently Protos has a licence for over 700 two-way lorry movements to the site which could really affect Helsby, especially if the motorway is closed.

We understand that Protos claim that they have had little response to 'marketing' the rail link to business despite Biffa, one of the companies at the site, having stated that they are planning to move fifty percent of waste by rail in the near future.

HIGHEST YOUTH SCOUTING AWARD FOR CHARLOTTE

On Sunday 21st April, Charlotte, a Cub leader at 1st Helsby, was invited down to Windsor Castle to attend the Scouts Annual Day of Celebration in recognition of achieving her King's Scout Award, the highest youth award in Scouting.

Charlotte has been involved in Scouting from a young age, joining 1st Helsby as a Scout at the age of 10, and becoming a Young Leader whilst an Explorer Scout, before returning as a Cub leader again upon finding a job locally after university.

The King's Scout Award was the result of over five years of hard work for Charlotte, and involved completing the Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award, 18 nights away with the Scouts and completing six activities with international, community, and Scout values themes. Charlotte's award highlights included organising activities at Chamboree, Cheshire's international Jamboree for Scouts and Guides held every four years, and being part of the team that organised a sleepover for Cubs in Chester Cathedral during 2023, under the art installation GAIA.

The day itself at Windsor was a truly

special occasion where Charlotte was joined in the parade by 11 other Scouts from Cheshire, and had the privilege of meeting esteemed guests including Chief Scout Bear Grylls, as well as marching in the parade with other award holders from across the Country.

Charlotte hopes to inspire others at 1st Helsby and beyond by achieving the award and is looking forward to continuing to provide young people with opportunities for adventure and skills for life through Scouting.
